Postdoctoral Researcher Position In the Matsumoto lab at Monell Chemical Senses Center

A Postdoctoral Researcher position is currently available in the Matsumoto Laboratory at the Monell Chemical Senses Center. The research will focus on the molecular mechanisms of taste cell turnover and characterizing a novel taste cell subset in mice. There will also be opportunities to expand the projects or develop a new line of research related to the ongoing project. The Matsumoto lab is highly collaborative and works closely with several Monell laboratories and researchers at other institutions. The postdoctoral researcher should expect to be a part of a stimulating intellectual environment.

Requirements include a Ph.D. or equivalent degree in molecular biology, genetics, neuroscience, physiology or related fields. A background in chemosensory research is not required; however, sufficient knowledge and expertise in molecular biology, developmental biology, biochemistry, genetics, physiology, and/or neuroscience are preferred. Prospective candidates who have different expertise are also encouraged to apply.

This position is supported by NIH and industry grants, and the stipend is in accordance with NIH standards.
