The Department of Psychology at the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor position in Experimental Psychology to start August 2018. We seek applicants who are broadly trained and able to teach a range of undergraduate and graduate courses. Potential courses include (but are not limited to) Statistics, Research Methods, Learning, Cognitive Psychology, Sensation and Perception, Behavioral Neuroscience, History of Psychology, Upper-level Capstone Laboratories, and other courses in the candidate's area of expertise. As a faculty member, the successful applicant will teach three courses per semester, maintain an active program of research/scholarly activity, and be active in service to the Department, University, and community/profession.

Candidates must have completed an earned doctorate in Experimental Psychology (broadly defined) prior to the start date of employment. Area of specialization within Experimental Psychology is open. The ideal candidate will have a strong background in both teaching and research. Candidates should have a commitment to excellence in teaching, research, productive scholarly activity, and mentorship to undergraduate and graduate students.

The successful candidate will become part of a dynamic and growing program which houses the second largest undergraduate major and the largest graduate program in the College of Arts & Sciences. The university and department have a strong commitment to achieving diversity among faculty and staff. We are particularly interested in receiving applications from members of under-represented groups and strongly encourage women and persons of color to apply.
